Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS.:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 7th day of October, A. D. 1876, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Heeatur in said county there, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from Parsonville in Heeatur

Up to intersect Township road leading from Houtzdale at or near the premises of Henry Allsopp in the village of Sterling Woodward Township

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

John L. Little John Low and Frank Parsons

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace, now holding a General Sessions at Clearfield Pennsylvania at January Term A.D. 1877.

The undersigned viewers duly appointed, in and by virtue of the Order of Court hereto annexed, Respectfully Report,

That they first gave due, timely, and legal notice, of the time and place of meeting of the viewers, by advertisements duly posted in public places adjacent to the line of the proposed road, for more than five days previous to making the view, that on the day appointed they met at Parsonville, all the viewers being present, and began opposite a Hemlock stump near the centre of Parsonville, and thence South 37° West one hundred and fifty eight perches, thence South 39° West sixteen perches, South $51\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ West forty perches, South 36° West crossing Gop Run in all eighty four perches to Township Road now "Tectonic Street" in the village of North Houtzdale, on which the Public School Houses are erected, that said viewers were first duly sworn or affirmed before making the view, and as the hill over which said road is laid is being undermined for coal, and the route proposed by the order to terminate at or near the premises of Henry Alltop would run along the breast of the hill, and the ground be likely to "cave in", they have laid it on ground likely to remain an even surface and to accommodate the people of a large and growing village in their passage between said points. No Damages assessed, Road returned for ^{Public use}. All which is respectfully submitted.
