# Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS.:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 28 day of March, A. D. 1876, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township Lawrence of, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from Nicholas Street in West Clearfield to intersect Library Street in West Clearfield - along line of William Street

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

James Mitchell Matthew Read Wm Alexander Den-  
ing who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.



1876 and adjourned to meet again on the 3.  
day of June A.D. 1876 at which time we all  
met agreeably thereto and after being duly  
sworn according to law we proceeded to view  
and layout and believing the same to be neces-  
sary for public use as follows to wit Beginning  
at Clearfield Street (West Clearfield) thence along  
the line of William Street 410 ft. to Nichols St.
