At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the *Sixteenth* day of *January*, A. D. 187*6*, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of *Hastion*, in said county *of Clearfield*, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from *Tyler's Station B. B. R. R.* to point in Public road in *Hastion Township* or near ^{Bruck} *Quelling House occupied by David* or near *"Tyler"* *Tyler*

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

To the honorable the Judges of the Court of
Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County Pa.

The undersigned one of the Jury appointed in
reference to a public road leading from Tyler
Station on B. B. R. R. to near Davis Tylers &c.
would report as follows.

After having giving more than 5 days public
notice - they met on the ground March 18th
1876. - Now sworn according to Law.

A road has been opened here before - part of
the way by Hilbert Otto & Miller at their expense -
There is occasion for a Public Road as aske for.
They propose to lay out the same as fol-
lows. Beginning about four rods South westerly
from the Depot at Tyler Station thence S. 74° W.
four rods - thence N. 40° W. four rods to cross
the track of Bennett's Branch R. R. thence N. 41° W.
thirty two rods. thence by the present travelled
lane N. 72½° W. nineteen rods - passing Bennett's
Branch on a bridge - thence N. 20° W. sixty six ¼
rods. thence N. 76½° W. twenty five ¼ perches
thence N. 36° W. five ¼ rods to corner of Public
highway about 50 rods east of Davis Tylers.
We recommend the road to be laid a width
of 30 feet.

Davis Tyler claims damages - the road
passing through 66 rods of valuable cleared land.

We assess the damages at twenty five dollars -

Also J. E. Paterson & Co. claim thirty ^{\$34.00} four dollars
for repairs on the Bennett's Branch bridge during
last year. We suggest that this should be
paid by the Township of Huston - thirty four dollars.
