Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS.:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 28th day of March, A. D. 1876, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of, in ~~said county~~ Pike & Lawrence, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from Jacob Le Bangers in Pike Township to intersect the Public Road in Lawrence Twp at or near the Line of Abraham Ogden's

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

S. F. McCloskey, Joseph Bailey, and Reuben Hall

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as, agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

We the undersigned persons Appointed by the within Order of Court, to view and lay out the Road therein mentioned Respectfully report, That having given notice of the time and place of meeting, according to the act of Assembly, And being all present at the view of the ground proposed for the said road, and having all been sworn or affirmed in pursuance of the said Order, we have viewed, and laid out, and do return the following Road. viz: Beginning at a Post near Jacob Bangers House, Thence through his Land, North Thirty Seven Degrees East, ($N. 37^{\circ} E.$) Twenty, (20) perches, Thence North Eighty Six Degrees East ($N. 86^{\circ} E.$) Crossing the line of Banger, and Abram Ogden (And line of Pike and Laurence Townships) Twenty (20) perches, to a Ch^t. Thence South forty three and a half Degrees East, ($S. 43\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E.$) Seven (7), perches Thence North Eighty One Degrees East, ($N. 81^{\circ} E.$) Nine (9) perches, Thence North Sixty One Degrees East, ($N. 61^{\circ} E.$) Twenty (20) perches to a W. Pine.
