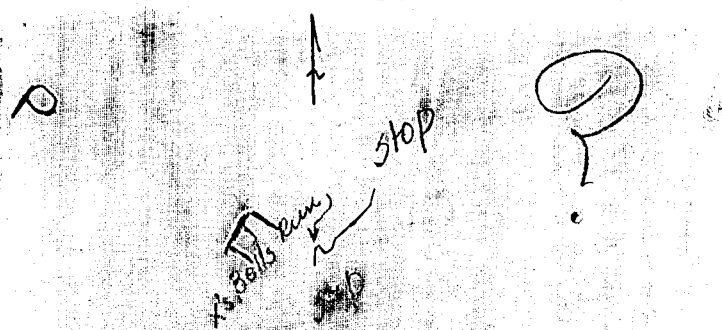

written & printed advertisements put up according to Law
of the time & place of said view, and also having given
notice to owners & occupants of lands through which said
road was intended to pass of the same - and we having
enquired as to damages resulting to any one by reason
of the passage of said road have ascertained that no dam-
age results to any one - and having been duly affirmed
we have viewed laid out and do return for Public
use the following road - Viz. Beginning at a Post
on Bells Run Road between Wm. Tilymans & The Walls mill
thence North 71 degrees East 29 1/2 perches to a Hemlock
thence North 65 degrees East 6 1/2 perches to a Post at foot of Hill -
thence South 47° East - 18 perches - South 75° East - 4 1/2 Perches
to a Hem Stump - North 57° East - 12 perches to a Hemlock - North
30° East - 12 perches - North 49 degrees East - 40 Perches to a
Hemlock, North 42 1/2 degrees East - 52 perches to a W Pine - thence
North 16 1/2 degrees East - 40 Perches to the end of a Public road

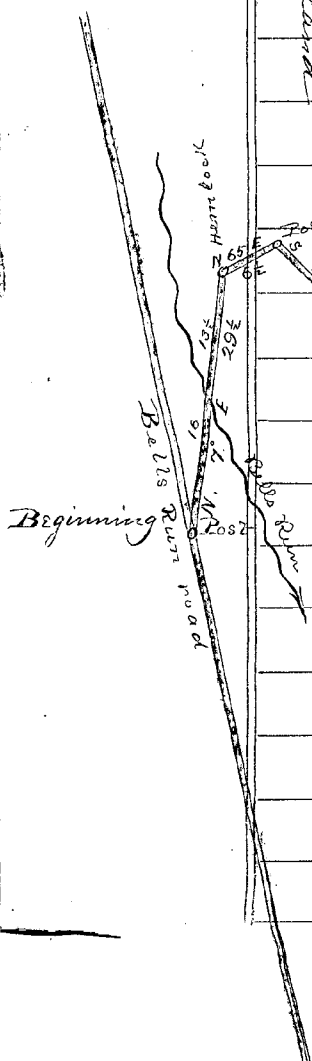

Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS.:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the *fifth* day of *June*, A. D. 187*6*, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of, ~~in said county~~ *Penn*, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from *Public road between T walls mill and William Hynns to Reuben Walls farm*

Report as to Damages

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Thos W Moore J. F. Sharp D. A. C. Moore

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
