James Mitchell, Patrick Healey and David J. Sharp

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground ^{proposed} ~~proposed~~ for said ^{change} ~~road~~; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such ~~road~~ ^{change} ~~road~~, they shall proceed, to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for ~~road~~ ^{change} ~~road~~, and the ~~shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make~~

~~report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road; together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.~~

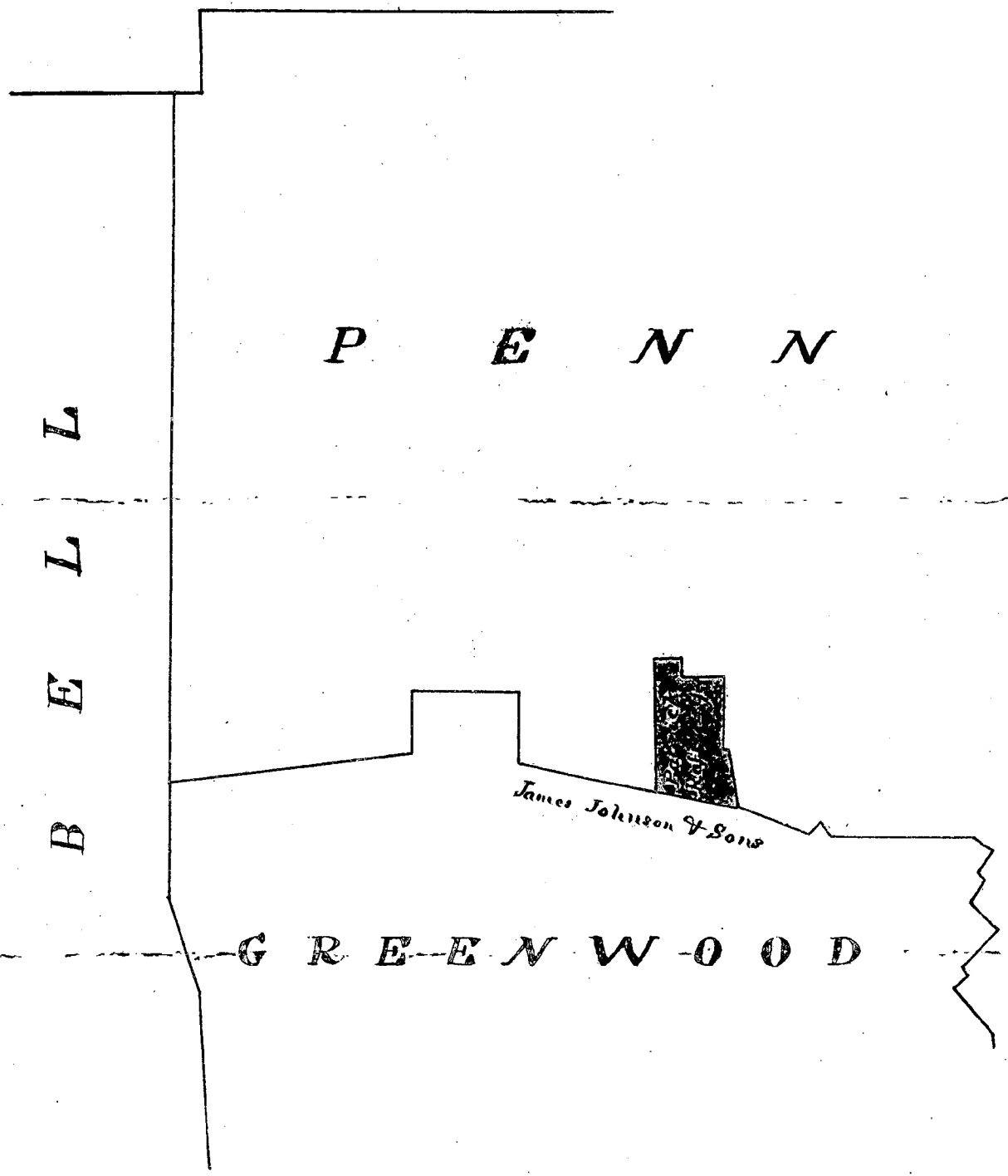
