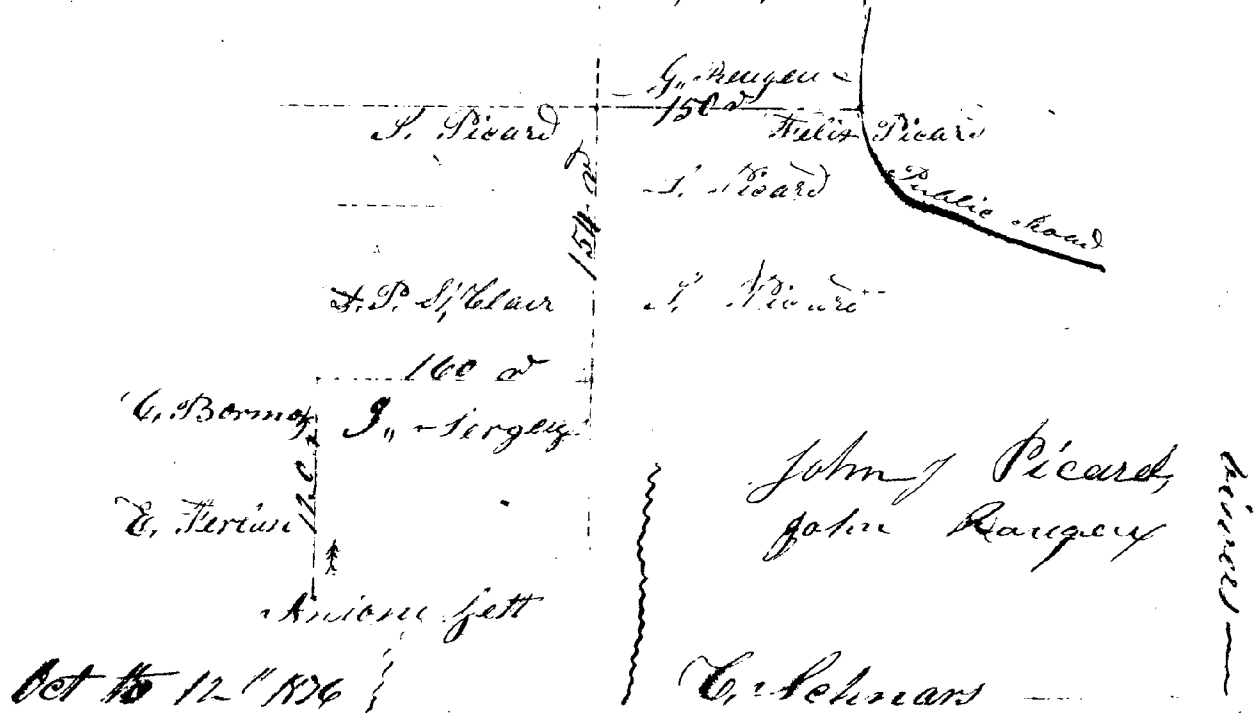

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court
of Quarter Sessions of the Peace, in and for
Clearfield County.

The undersigned, persons
appointed, by the within order of Court,
to view, and lay out the road therein men-
tioned, - all being present, and first severally
sworn according to Law, - do report, that,
in pursuance of said order, we have viewed &
laid out, and do return for Public use,
the following road, to wit: Beginning at
A. Galt, Thence west, one hundred & twenty rods,
120 r. Thence North one hundred & sixty rods,
160 r. Thence west, one hundred & fifty four,
154 r. Thence North, one hundred & fifty rods
150 r. To F. Picard, at the Horvath's road.
584 r being five hundred & eighty four rods. -
with the improvements along, on both sides
of the road, with a draft of the same.

Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS.:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 28th day of March, A. D. 1876, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Covington in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from Autony Gette to the Public road near Felix Piccard's house.

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint John Piccard John Rougeux ^{and} Charles Schuass who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
