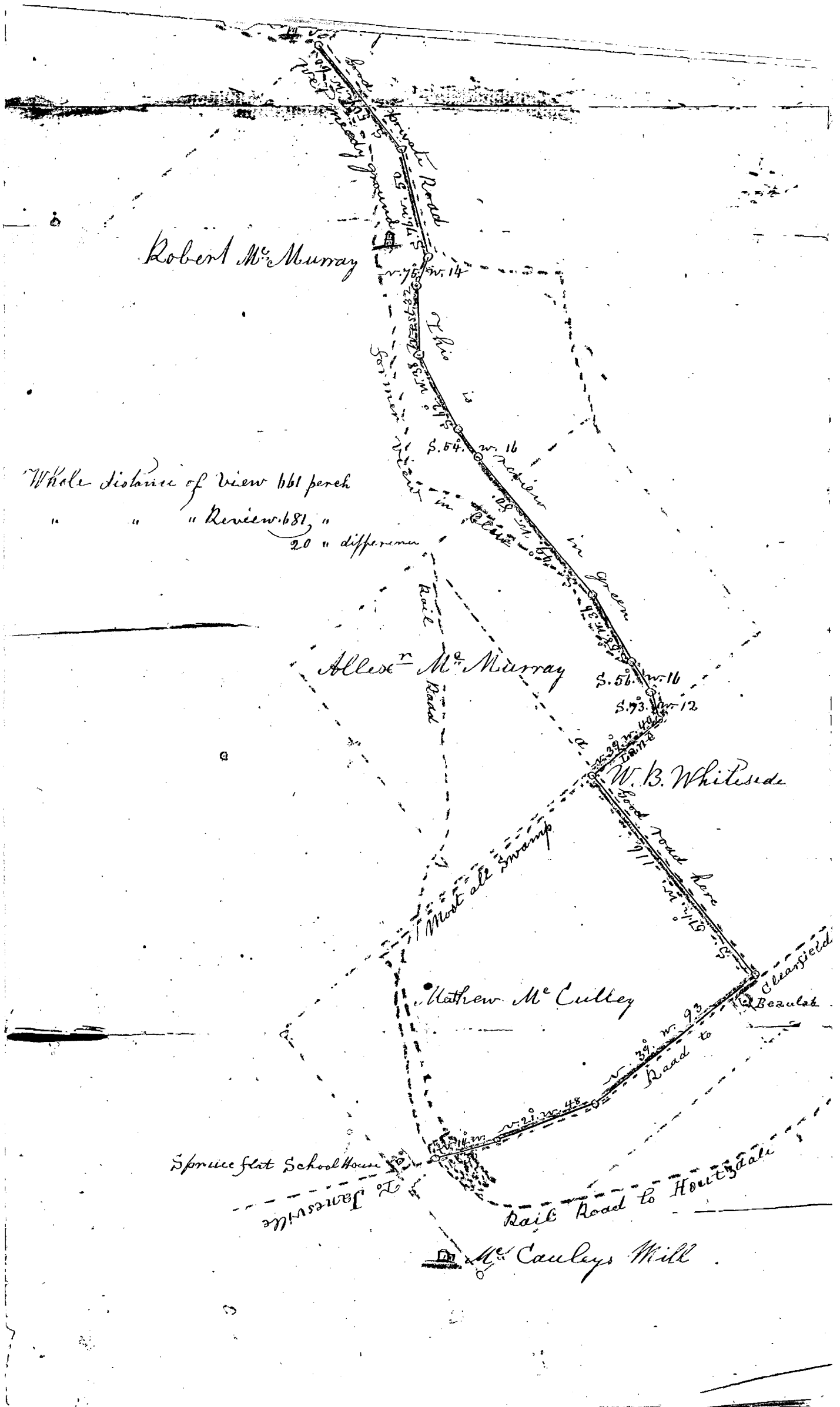
Road Viewers' Report.

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view ^{the} and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint ~~Joseph, and Sallaker~~ ^{Stark & Frank Merkle} who, after being respectively sworn, or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them



To the Honourable the Judges within Named

We, the persons appointed to review the Road within mentioned, and parts adjacent, having first been duly affirmed according to law, and first given notice according to law, and on which there is no damages;

do Report, That in pursuance of said Order, we have reviewed laid out ^{and printing} for public use, the following Road, to wit: Beginning at School House in Spruce flat, on public road leading to Beaulah Church, thence North 14° West, thirty perch, thence North 21° West forty eight perch, thence North 39° West ninety three perch to Beaulah Church, thence South 51° West one hundred and sixteen perch, thence North 39° West forty perch, thence South 73° West twelve perch, thence South 56° West sixteen perch, thence South 58° West thirty six perch, thence ^{South} 49° West eighty perch, thence South 54° West sixteen perch, thence South 62° West thirty eight perch, thence West thirty two perch thence North 75° West fourteen perch, thence South 76° West fifty perch, thence South 50° West sixty perch to Muddy run School House, A draft whereof is herewith annexed; Witness our hands this 6th day of September 1896

agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay-out the same, as agreed to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
