Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS.:

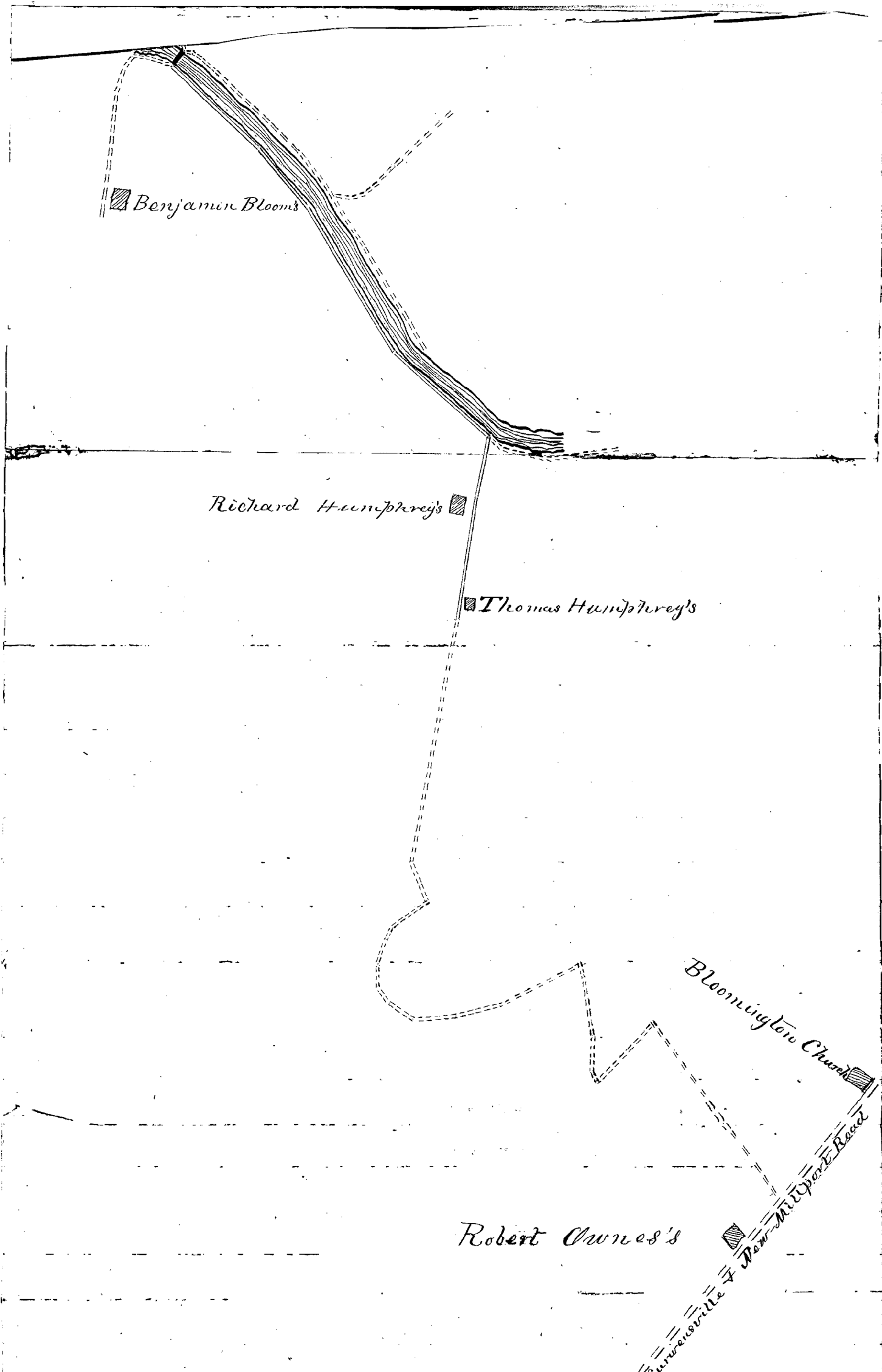
At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the Seventh day of Oct, A. D. 1876, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of, ~~in said county~~ Pike, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from the new Bridge at farm now occupied by Henry Wagoner known as the Benf. Bloom Bridge to the road leading from Curwensville to new Millport at or near Bloomington

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Jas Mitchell H T Dunlap and Samuel Ardery who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

To the Honorable the judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the County of Clearfield We the persons appointed by the annexed order of Court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned do report:— That after giving due public notice of the time and place of Meeting we met agreeably thereto on the 14th day of Dec. A.D. 1876 and after being duly sworn or affirmed according to law we proceeded to view and layout and believing the same to be necessary we now return the same for public use as follows viz. Beginning on the public road that leads from Conowingo to New Millport at a point near Bloomington thence through improved land of Robert Ooms along a lane formerly a public Road N. 35 1/4 W. 69 per to end of lane thence same course (N. 35 1/4 W.) 4 per to Stake in centre of road thence S 45 W. 28 1/2 per. to Pine Bush to left of road (the last course goes through improved land of Robert Ooms about 4 per. thence N. 26 W. 2 per to Ironwood to left of road thence N. 2 W. 14 1/2 per. W. Pine to left of Road thence N. 7 W. 20 per Sugar to right of Road thence N. 15 W. 3 8/10 per. to Hickory to right thence S. 65 W. 3 1/10 per. to W. O. K. to right S. 68 W. 16 per to Hickory to left thence S 86 W 15.5 per. to Double Sugar to left thence N. 56 W. 10 per to Beech sep. to left thence N. 35 1/2 W. 7 per to Stake to left thence N. 2 E. 8 per W. Pine to left thence N. 18 E. 9 per. Dead Reed dr. to left thence N. 28 1/2 E. 4 1/2 per to map. to left thence N. 53 E. 15 1/2 per Stake thence N. 23 W 21 per. to Stake thence N. 11 1/2 W. at 65 per. Thomas Humphreys's Stable and Township Road (the last course is through improved land of Richard Humphreys for about 61 per. about one half of which is a lane thence on Township Road N. 9 1/2 E. 43 per. thence on same N. 13 E. 22 to river road thence on same up the river N. 48 1/2 W. 45 per. thence on same N. 32 W. 61 per. thence on same N. 39 W. 22 per. thence on same N. 48 W. 42 per. to end of new bridge near Benj. Blomfurn. Total distance 1 3/4 miles + 20 per. Total dis. of new road 1 mile + 25 per. dis. of new road not laid on what was formerly an old road about 3/4 of a mile.
