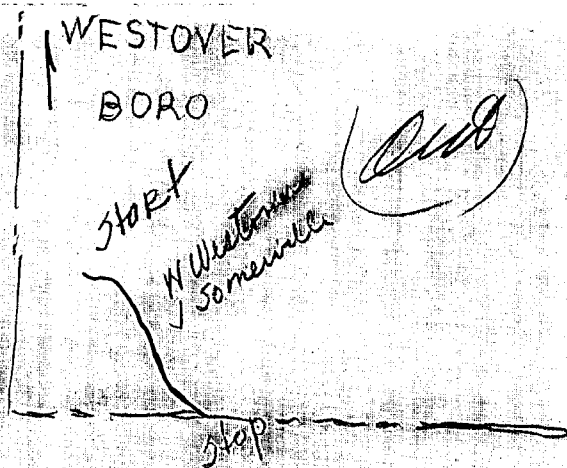

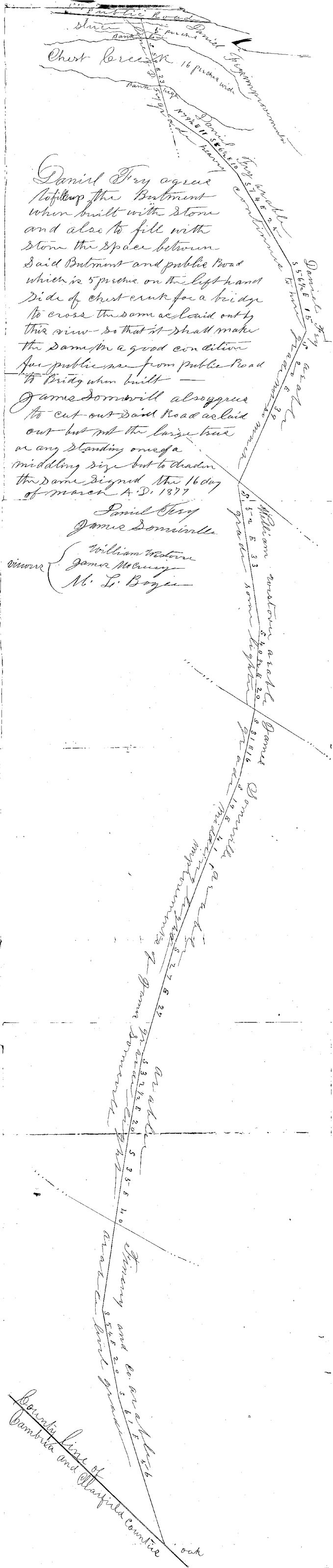

James L. McNamee Junior David W. Thompson

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the des~~ired~~ shortest distance, in such manner as to do the same

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

We the persons appointed by annexed
order of court to view and lay out
the Road therein mentioned do
report; that in pursuance thereof
after giving public notice according
to law having been duly sworn
and affirmed all the viewers appointed
by said order having viewed the ground
proposed for the within mentioned Road
and the undesignated view do agree
there is occasion for a road as desired
by the petitioners and that the same
is necessary for a public Road and having
had respect to the shortest distance
and best ground for such Road
we have laid it out in such a manner
as should do the least injury to private
property and as far as practicable
agreeably to the desires of the
petitioners and do return for public
use the following described Road
commencing at the public Road on line
of Daniel Fry and others at a Buck Stump
thence across Chest Creek South fifty nine
Degrees East sixteen perches thence the same
course seven perches thence through the
arable lands of Daniel Fry North twenty
nine and one half Degrees East eleven
perches thence through the same South
eighty six and a half Degrees East
ten perches thence through the same South twenty
four Degrees East twenty five perches thence
through the same South fifty six and a
half Degrees East fifteen perches this for
grade quite heavy thence through
the same South twenty Degrees East
thirty nine perches thence through the
arable lands of William Whistover South
fifty two Degrees East thirty three perches
thence through the same South forty and
a half Degrees East twenty perches thence
through the arable lands of James Somerville
South thirty one Degrees East sixteen perches
thence through the same South nineteen
Degrees East forty one perches thence by
the improvements of James Somerville South
twenty seven Degrees East twenty seven
perches thence through the same South
thirty two and a half Degrees East twenty perches
thence through the same South thirty five
Degrees East forty perches thence through
the arable lands of Finny Lee South fifty
four East twenty perches thence by the same
South sixty one Degrees East fifty six perches
to the county line of Cambria & Clarfild entire
length one mile and twenty six perches a plot
