Order to Assess Damages ^{Whereas} at Court of
Quarter Session of the Peace held in
and for the County of Clearfield at Clear-
field PA on the 7th of January 1877 before
the Judges of Said Court, the Petition of
John Santz was presented setting forth

That he is engaged in logging and
lumbering in Chest Township Clearfield
County PA and partly in Burnside Town-
ship said County and that in pursuit
of his business it is absolutely necessary
to pass through lands of William Summa-
=ville a distance of eight or thereabouts
And that the same has been crossed hereto-
=fore for the same purpose for which
Your petitioner represents that there is now
a wooden slide upon said premises which
has been used by others in the logging bus-
=ness at that place that Your petitioner
endeavored to agree with said William Sum-
=merville upon Amount of damages to be
paid him for use of land as aforesaid, he
the said Summerville having failed or re-
=fused to put or name any sum therefor

And therefore Pray the Court to
appoint Three disinterested persons to
view and assess ^{the} damages as in such case
made and provided

Whereup due consideration thereof the Court appointed John S. Allison Horrace Patchin Anthony McGarvey Viewers who are to go upon the premises and after being duly sworn or affirmed are to view the premises and Assess the Damages if any which the Said William Summervill has sustained by reason of the Said John Santz crossing the premises as aforesaid due regard being had to the advantage and disadvantage of the Same - And are to make report thereof to the Court

certain Attorney, Executors, Administrators or Assigns,
the just sum of the Damages that may be awarded and
confirmed to him by the Court of Quarter Sessions—
under the Act of Assembly Approved 17 May 1871 +
for crossing the land of William Sumnerville in the
lumbering operations of John Lutzky in the year
AD 1876 + 1877,

without any fraud or further delay, then the above Obligation to be void, or else to be and
remain in full force and virtue.

To the Honorable the Judges of the said Court, The petition of
John Lantzy Respectfully represents, that he is engaged
in logging and lumbering in Chest Township Blairfield
County Penna, and partly in Riverside Township said County
And that in the pursuit of his business he is absolutely neces-
sary to pass through lands of William Summerville, a
distance of ~~forty rods~~, eighty rods or thereabouts, and
that the same has been crossed hereto-fore for the
same purpose, for which your petitioner desires to
use it; that your petitioner further represents that there
is now a wooden slide upon said premises which
has been used by others in the logging business at
that place. That your petitioner endeavored to agree
with said William Summerville upon the amount
of damages to be paid him for the use of his land as
aforesaid, he the said Summerville having failed or refused
to put or name any sum therefor.

Now therefore your
petitioner presents this his petition accompanied with
his bond in the sum of Two hundred dollars, contri-
buted for the payment of such damages as may be
allowed said William Summerville by the viewers-
and confirmed by the Court, together with the costs, &c
And therefore prays Your Honorable Court to appoint
three disinterested persons to view & assess the
damages as in such cases made & provided by
the Act of Assembly approved, 17 May 1891
