Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS.:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 21st day of May, A. D. 1877, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of, in said county, ^{Morris} ~~Bridge~~, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a ~~road~~ ^{bridge} or highway leading from at the mouth of Black

Moshannon in said Township and they further respectfully represent that the erection of such a bridge over the Big Moshannon at Black Moshannon at that place would be attended with more expense than Morris Township should reasonably bear.

And, therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

James Mitchell J. L. Merrill & Nicholas Tolner

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road ^{bridge} and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, ^{bridge} they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ^{bridge} ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

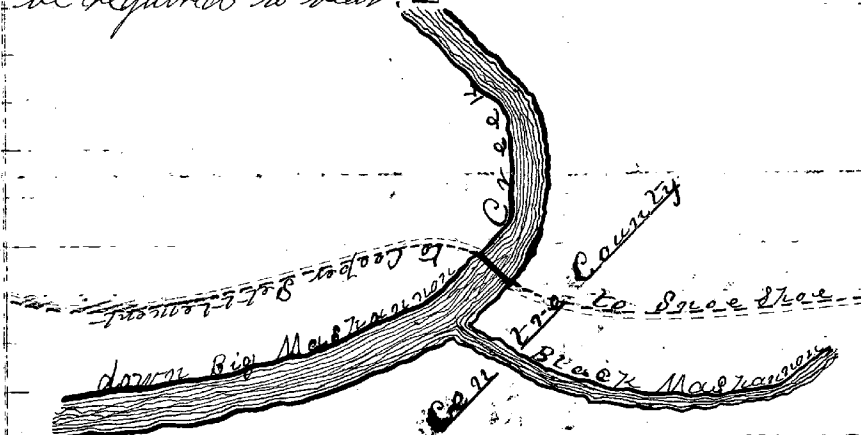

That after giving due public notice of the time and place of meeting we all met agreeably thereto on the 29 day of June A. D. 1877 and after being duly sworn according to law we proceeded to view the site where the Township of Morris ask assistance to build a bridge in above order mentioned and it is our opinion that a bridge across the big Moshannon below the mouth of Black Moshannon where the Public Road crosses the same is necessary for public use and that the cost of said bridge will be more than the Township of Morris should be required to bear.
