Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS.:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the *Sixth* day of *October*, A. D. 187*7*, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township *Goshute*, in said county

, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from *a Public Road at or near the end of lane on A. A. Reeds Land to a point on a Public Road near George Meaders House*

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

James Mitchell Austin Shiry & Philip Reese

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

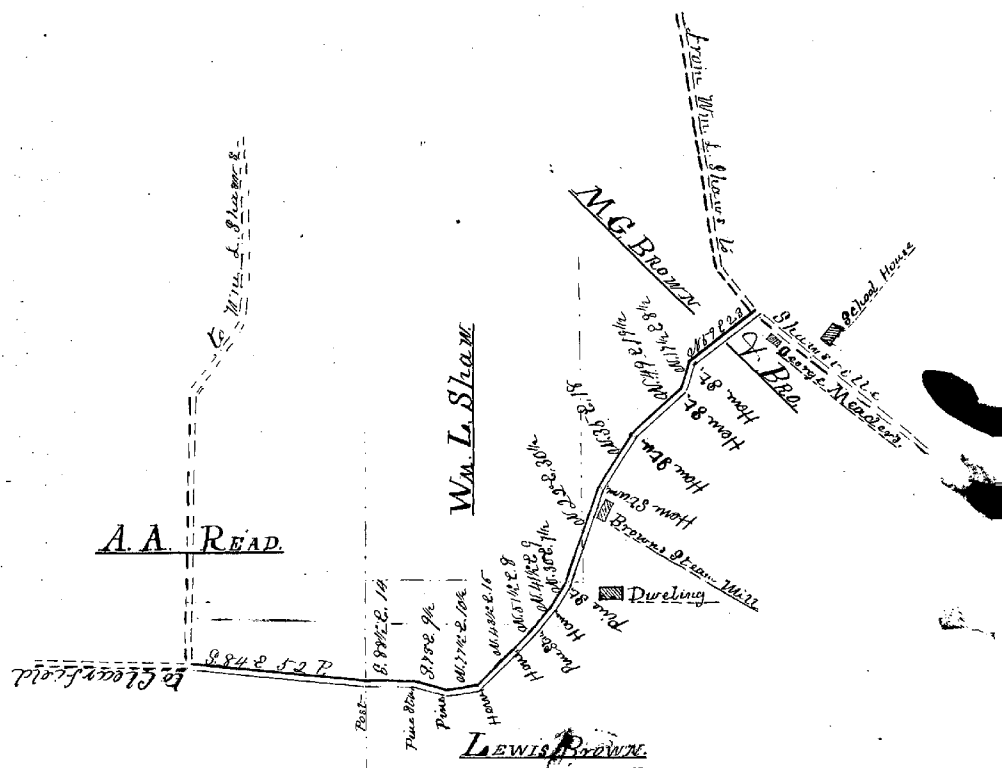

To the Honorable ~~the~~ Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the County of Clearfield.

We the persons appointed by the annexed order of Court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned, do report: That after giving due public notice of the time and place of meeting we all met agreeably thereto on the twenty second day of May A.D. 1878; and after being severally sworn according to law we proceeded to view the ground proposed for said road, believing the same to be necessary we now return the following road for public use to wit: Beginning at turn of road or lane on A.A. Read's farm, thence through improved land of A.A. Read south eighty four degrees East fifty two perches to post and line of land of Lewis Brown, thence ~~south~~ eighty eight and a half East fourteen perches to High pine stump, thence south seventy three degrees East nine and a half perches to White Pine, thence North seventy seven and a half degrees East ten and a half perches to Hemlock thence North forty three and a half degrees East fifteen perches to Hemlock, thence North fifty one and a half degrees East eight perches to Pine Stump thence North forty one and a half degrees East nine perches to Hemlock, thence North thirty degrees East seven and a half perches Pine Stump, thence North twenty two degrees East thirty and a half perches Hemlock Stump, thence North ^{thirty five} degrees East eighteen perches Hemlock Stump, thence ^{thirty nine} degrees East nineteen and a half perches to Hemlock Stump, thence North seventeen and a half East eight and a half perches to Hemlock Stump, thence North fifty nine degrees East twenty three perches to Public Road near George Meaders House, "Whole distance of road laid out is two hundred and twenty five perches and is laid through improved land of A.A. Read, through unimproved and improved land of Lewis Brown, through unimproved land of Wm L. Shaw, and through improved and unimproved land of M. G. Brown and Brother.

We also further report: That we have assessed the damages to all persons that will be damaged by the making of said road through their land, viz: to A.A. Read sixty (60.00) dollars, to Wm L. Shaw three (3.00) dollars,
