At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 29 day of May A. D. 1878, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Burnside, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from the Township Road at the end of William Harms lane to the Township road near W. J. Westons

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Hampshire County. We the undersigned viewers appointed by the annual order for the purpose therein mentioned do report, That our present survey thereof William Murray Mitchell Hope & John H Carr the three previous said order mentioned having been first severally sworn or affirmed and after giving due public notice of the time & place of meeting, met at the time appointed and proceeded to view and lay out the same, and do agree that such road is necessary, and having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for said road have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property and as far as practicable suitable to the power of the petitioner and do deliver for the use of the petitioner the following described road.

ROAD VIEWERS' REPORT.

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 27th day of March A. D. 1876, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Girard; in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from

the public road leading from Rarthus passing the mouth of Warlick to Clearfield to the dwelling house of Benjamin Perry

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint William Murray Mitchell, Shope and John Carr, who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law. By the Court.

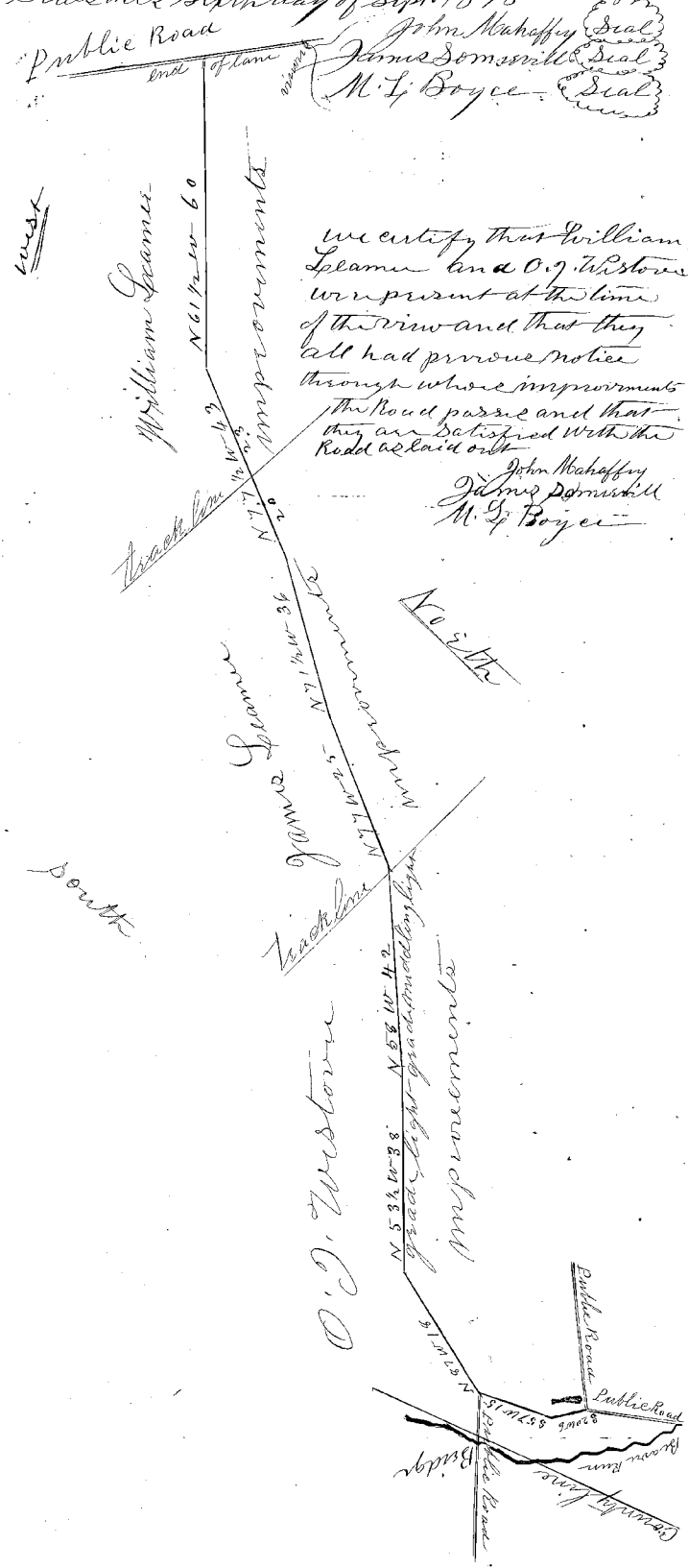

 with the persons appointed by annexed order
 of court to view and lay out the Road
 therein mentioned do report: that in
 pursuance thereof after giving due
 and public notice according to law
 having been duly sworn and affirmed
 all the jurors appointed by said order
 having viewed the ground proposed for
 the within mentioned Road and the under
 signed jurors do agree there is occasion
 for a Road as desired by the petitioner
 and that the same is necessary for a public
 Road and having had respect to the shortest
 distance and best ground for such Road
 we have laid it out in such a manner
 as should do the least injury to private
 property and as far as practicable agreeably
 to the desires of the petitioner and do
 return for public use the following dis-
 cribed Road commencing at the Public Road
 thence through the improvements of O. J. Westover
 South twenty degrees west six perches thence
 through the same South fifty seven west
 fifteen perches thence through the same grade
 light North eighty seven Degrees west
 Eighteen perches thence through the same
 grade light North fifty three and a half degrees
 west thirty eight perches thence through the
 same grade middling light North fifty eight
 degrees west forty two perches thence through the
 improvements of James Leaman grade middling
 light North twenty seven Degrees west twenty
 five perches thence through the same grade
 light North twenty one and a half Degrees
 west thirty six perches thence through the
 same grade middling light North twenty
 seven and half Degrees west twenty perches
 thence through the improvements of William
 Leaman the same course twenty three perches
 thence through the improvements of William
 Leaman grade light North sixty one and a
 half degrees west sixty perches to public
 Road and end of William Leaman Lane the
 entire length 283 perches a plot or draft
 map is herewith annexed which said Road
