ROAD VIEWERS' REPORT.

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 3rd day of Oct, A. D. 1870, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Chest Township in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of ~~a road or highway~~ ^{change in township line} leading from

by an Extension of the South Western Boundary of Township to the Eastern line of the Newburg Township to enclose the School District in Chest Township known as the Wilson Wood District also to annex the farm of Joseph Patterson in Jordan Township to Township Twp

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint James Mitchell & Harold S. Parrott

, who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said ~~road~~ ^{change township line}; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such ~~road~~ ^{change}, they shall proceed to lay out the same

agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly

whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law. By the Court.

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of
Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the county
of Cleaveland:

The undersigned, by the annexed order,
Commissioners for the purposes therein mentioned,
Respectfully report:

That having giving notice to the
inhabitants of the Townships of Ferguson, Chest
and Jordan of the time and place of their meeting
as in said order directed, they met at the house of
Luther Barnett in Ferguson Township on the sec-
ond day of December, instant, and having been du-
ly sworn and affirmed to perform the duties as-
signed to them by said order, with fidelity, and hav-
ing inquired into the propriety of granting the prayer
of the petition in said order mentioned, they made a
plot or draft of the division line of the said Town-
ships of Ferguson, Chest and Jordan and also,
of the division lines proposed to be made, in the said
order, of said Townships which are as follows,
viz.: (between Ferguson and Chest Township) Begin-
ning at a corner of Greenwood, Ferguson and
Bell Townships, thence by Bell Township South
fifty-four degrees West three hundred and sev-
enty perches to a corner of Newburg borough;
~~thence by said borough, South fifty-two de-~~
grees West two hundred and thirty perches, thence
by said borough North thirty-seven and a half
degrees East one hundred and four perches, thence
by said borough North fifty-two degrees East
one hundred and sixty-one perches, thence, by
said borough South thirty-seven and a half de-
grees East two hundred perches, thence by same

Hence South fifty-two degrees West one hundred eighty perches along what is now the line between said Townships Ferguson and Jordan to the place of beginning; They further report that they are of opinion that the change and erection of the division lines between said Townships according to the aforesaid lines would be to the convenience of the inhabitants thereof, and therefore that in the opinion of the Commissioners it is proper, that the prayer of the petitioners should be granted and that such change should be made in the division lines of said Township.
