To the Hon. Judges within named.

We the undersigned persons, appointed by the within Order of Court, to view, and lay out the Road therein mentioned, Respectfully report. That having given notice of the time, and place of meeting, according to the act of Assembly; And all being present, at the view of the ground proposed for the said road; And having all been sworn or Affirmed, in pursuance of the said Order of Court. We have viewed, and laid out, and do return the following, road viz. Beginning at a point on the Road leading from Puseyville, to Newmillport, by marked White Oak, Beech, and Hemlock, trees. On land belonging to William Irvin & Heirs. Thence through their land, North twenty one degrees East. Forty perches. North Eleven and a half degrees East, Twenty perches. North Forty four and a half degrees, East nineteen perches. North Seventy three and a half degrees East, Thirty three perches. North Sixty two and a half degrees, East, Ten perches. North Forty three and a half degrees East, Six perches. North Eleven degrees West. Twenty Eight perches. North Fifty two degrees West. Thirty four perches. Thence through land of Barnard Farren, and James Haley, North Forty three and a half degrees East. Eighty four perches. North nineteen degrees West, Ten perches. North nineteen degrees East, Twenty perches. North Thirty three and a fourth degrees East, Forty perches. North forty six and a half degrees East, Thirteen perches. North Fifty one and a quarter degrees East, Sixty two perches. North Fifty Eight and a half degrees East. Thirty six and five tenths perches, to the line of Thayer and Hyms. Thence through Hyms' land. North Eighty five and a half degrees East Sixty Eight perches. To a white oak. Thence through land of Saml. Lambert

South Eighty one and a half degrees, East, Seventy two perches.
North Seventy degrees East. Seventy six perches to a Post. Thence
North sixty four degrees East. Two Hundred and twenty six perches

twenty five degrees East. Sixteen perches. North fifty two
