To the Honorable, the Judges of the
Court of Quarter Sessions for the
County of Clearfield.

The petition of the Subscribers, being a
majority of the original petitioners, respect-
fully represents: That a petition was
presented to this court at the Session
next preceding June Session, A.D. 1868
Signed by your petitioners praying the
court to appoint proper persons to view
and lay out a road from a point
on the Indiana County line to a point
on the public road near Langdon's Mill
in Brunside Township, which was accord-
ingly done, and the Said Viewers so ap-
pointed did view, lay out and return for
public use a road, beginning at the
Indiana County line and intersecting a
road thereat, thence upon an inclined
plane through arable lands Widow
Moore South 84° East 62 Perches, thence
South 77° degrees East 40 Perches, through
the improvements of Widow Moore across one
field North 87° East 30 perches thence
along the lines of lands of D. W. Langdon
and Said widow Moore South 74° East
8 perches, thence due East 60 perches thence
through the improvements of D. W. Langdon

North 60° East 31 perches thence through
the same improvements North 36°
East 11 perches to the public road
leading from Cherrytree to Langdon's
Mill, and intersecting the same at or
near D.W. Langdon's on the Susquehanna
River, which was, on the 14th day
of January A.D. 1869, on due consid-
eration, approved of and confirmed
by the Court; that the said road not
yet having been opened, and it ap-
pearing to your petitioners to be useless,
and if opened would become burden-
some, and greatly damage valuable
property — they therefore pray the
Court to appoint persons not residing
on, or owning land on the route of the
said road, to view the same, and make
report according to law.
