ROAD VIEWERS' REPORT.

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 29 day of January, A. D. 1878, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Cohest, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from The Mouth of Rattling Run in New Bury Bor to the Newcomer improvement on Snyder Run in Bell Township.

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint S. D. McCloskey & J. Heard and E. Hildebrand, who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law. By the Court.

To the Hon Judges within named
We the undersigned Viewers appointed by the within
Order of Court, to view, and lay out the road therein
mentioned, Respectfully report,

That after giving notice of the time, and place of meeting
according to the Act of Assembly; And being all present
at the view of the ground proposed for the said road,
and having all been sworn, or Affirmed, in pursuance
of the said Order of Court. We have viewed, and laid out,
and do return the following road viz. Beginning at a
Point in the Public Road (in the Borough of Newburg)
leading from Newburg, to the mouth of Chest Creek, near
Halling Run. by a marked Cherry, and white Oak trees, thence
through land belonging to Rachel Hurd. North Twenty degrees
East; at sixteen perches cross the line of Rachel, into Land of L. J.
Hurd. Twenty two, perches to a Post. Thence North Thirty five
degrees East-Ten perches, North Seventy and a half degrees
East; Twenty Six and six tenths perches to a Hemlock.
North Forty five degrees East. Fourteen and five tenths
perches to a Hemlock. Thence North Twenty Four degrees,
East; at ten perches cross the line of Hurd and William Tucker
and out of the Boro. into Chest Township. Fourteen perches to
Post. Thence Through Tuckers land, North Six and a half
degrees East Forty two perches to a Hemlock. Thence
North Twenty six and a half degrees, East one hun-
-dred and fourteen perches, to Post. Thence North Thirty five
degrees East; at twelve perches crossing the line of Tucker
into land of L. J. Hurd. Eighteen perches. Thence North
Twenty Eight degrees East Sixteen perches to the line
of L. J. Hurd, and John & Miller, Thence through Millers
land North Thirty four degrees East. Thirty perches to
the line of J. D. Miller, and L. J. Hurd, also line of Borough

and Bell Township, Which said road as aforesaid laid
out; we are of opinion is necessary for a Public Road. A
draft whereof is herunto annexed. There is no damage
claimed for this road, and we don't believe any one ought
to have any. And we are of opinion that from this point
to to the Newcomer Improvement, a road is not necessary at
present; the distance is about a mile and no settlement near;
and the road would be expensive to make, and we believe
as very unnecessary expence to put upon a Township at this
time
