ROAD VIEWERS' REPORT.

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 17th day of May A. D. 1877, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Burnside, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road, or highway leading from

a point at or near where the public Road leading from Leaning Mill is intersected by Brush Run to a point on or near the Indiana County line

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises do order and appoint *Samuel Boyce* *Jeremiah Brickley* *John Sumner* who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly

whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law. By the Court.

We the persons appointed by annexed order of Court to view and lay out the Road there in mentioned do report that in pursuance thereof after giving due and public notice according to law having been duly sworn and affirmed all the viewers appointed by said order having viewed the ground proposed for the within mentioned Road and the undersigned viewers do agree there is occasion for a Road as desired by the petitioners and that the same is necessary for a public Road and having had respect to the shortest distances and best ground for a Road we have laid it out in such a manner as should do the least injury to private property and as far as practicable agreeably to the desires of the petitioners and do retain for public use the following described Road commencing at the public Road near the watering trough and Brushy Run at a post thence through the improvements of William and Joseph Moore and on line of the same or nearly so North sixty six and a quarter degrees west fifty two perches thence on line of William and Joseph Moore through the arable land of the same North seventy four degrees west eighty two perches thence through the same and land of William Moore North eighty eight and a half degrees west thirty perches to a post and county line of Indiana entire length one hundred and sixty four perches and grade all most level all the way a plot or draft whereof is inclosed annexed which said Road so as aforesaid laid out we are of the opinion is necessary for a public Road and we assess the damage to be none witness our hands and seals this 23rd day of June 1877
