in Gulick T^h and praying the Court to appoint proper
persons to review, vacate ~~and~~ ^{amend} the
portion of the said road in Gulick Town-
ship leading from Wells Mills to a point on
the plank road near Danesville with a
view of changing the same from Wells Mills
to a point near Elliotts corner on the road
now leading from Danesville to Uthville,
whereupon the Court, upon due considera-
tion had of the premises, do order and
appoint Frank Bolger, George Baister and
James P. Hale, who after being respectively
sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of
their appointment with impartiality and
fidelity, are to review the ground proposed

for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion to vacate, ~~and~~ supply said road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or a private road, together with a plan or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law. -

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, And make Report to the Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Don't St Geo Buzier Frank Bolger & Robt Itinamara who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th rule of Court.
