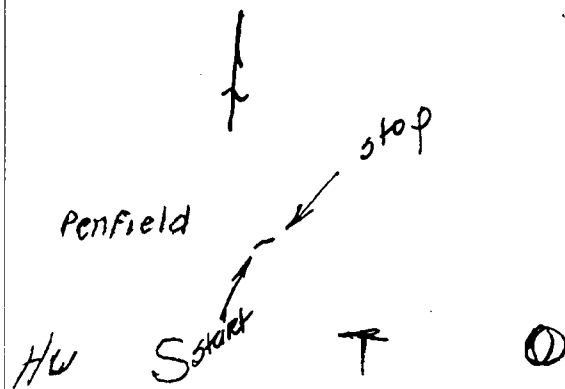

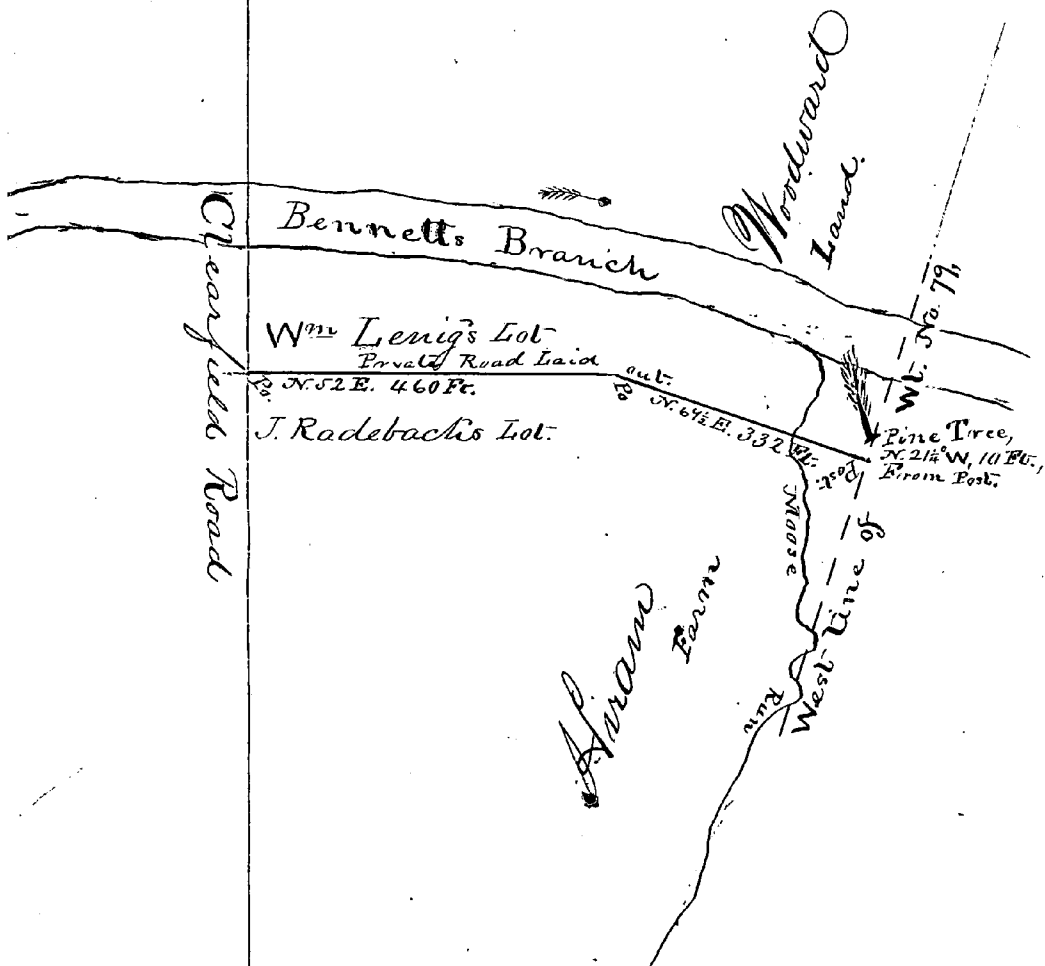
ROAD VIEWERS' REPORT.

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 17th day of January A. D. 1879, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of *Houston* in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the ^{use of} a road or highway leading from *Queen Birds Farm to a Clearfield road near John Radabaugh's* in *Houston* Township.

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint *Geo C. Kirke James Buchanan* *A. B. Hoover*, who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law. By the Court.

To the Honorable The Judges within
named, We the undersigned, appointed
by the annexed order do report, that we
have viewed the ground proposed
for the within mentioned road, after
having been duly sworn and affirmed,
and that we find that the same is
necessary for a private road; that we
have laid out said road as follows,
Beginning in the eastern line of the
Clearfield road, thence N. 52° E. four hundred
and sixty feet to post; thence N. 69½° E,
through lands of H. Woodward, three hundred
and thirty two feet to a Post in line of Lucian
Bird's farm, being also west line of Warrant
No. 79. A plot or draft of said road laid
out, we hereto attach. We further report
that we have made inquiry ^{as} to damages,
and find that no damages result to any
one, through whose land said road passes,
We further report that public notice was
given by notices put up at three of the most
public places in the vicinity ten days before
the view. In witness whereof we have here
unto set our hands, this 1st day of March
A.D. 1879.
