ROAD VIEWERS' REPORT.

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 22nd day of Sept. A. D. 1879, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Union, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from "Home Camp" School House in Union Township to intersect the road now leading from James Hall's place to Hunterburn at a point near the Hunter Township line

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration, had of the premises, do order and appoint S. J. W. Cluskey, H. B. Louns and John Brockbank, who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law. By the Court.

We The undersigned persons, Appointed by the within
Order of Court. to view, and lay out the Roads
therein mentioned. Respectfully reports.
That having given notice of the time and place
of Meeting, according to the act of assembly. and
being all present at the view of the ground proposed
for the said Road, and having all been sworn in
pursuance of the said Order of Court. (Together with
Thos. Brockibanti, who does not sign this Report.)
We have viewed, and laid out, and do return the
following Road. Viz. Beginning at a stone in the
Township Road, near "Home Camp" Schoolhouse in Union
Township. A corner of land belonging to Joseph Walker, ^{and} Napoleon Bonaparte, McDonald. and running on their line
North Eighty seven degrees ($N. 87^{\circ} E$) East forty nine (49) perches
to a stone cor of said Land. Thence North fifty seven ^{and a quarter} degrees
East ($N. 57^{\frac{1}{4}}^{\circ} E$) fifty Three (53) perches. Thence through Land of
Oliver McDonald. North two and three quarter degrees ($N. 2^{\frac{3}{4}}^{\circ}$)
West. Sixty six (66) perches. Thence through Land of Charles
Blanchard, North twenty two degrees East ($N. 22^{\circ} E$) forty
six (46) perches. North sixteen degrees ($N. 16^{\circ}$) West; sixty
seven (67) perches, North fifteen degrees East ($N. 15^{\circ} E$)
Two Hundred and nineteen (219) perches. to the line of
tracts Nos 3602 & 3606. Then Between them South Eighty seven
degrees ($S. 87^{\circ} E$) East. One Hundred and twenty seven and
five tenths perches. (127.5) Thence South forty four degrees East
($S. 44^{\circ} E$) one Hundred and Thirteen (113) perches Thence

South fifty five degrees East ($N. 65^{\circ} E.$) Twenty (20) perches
South eighty eight degrees East ($S. 88^{\circ} E.$) sixteen (16) perches
South thirty three degrees East ($S. 33^{\circ} E.$) fourteen (14) perches
South eighty nine degrees East. ($S. 89^{\circ} E.$) Thirteen (13) perches
South fifty four and a half degrees East. ($S. 54\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E.$) Twelve (12) perches
South sixty five degrees East ($S. 65^{\circ} E.$) nine (9) perches
South sixty degrees East ($S. 60^{\circ} E.$) twenty two (22) perches
To the Road leading from Walkerville to Winterburn
below, and near said Walkerville.

Which said road, as aforesaid laid out, we are of
opinion is necessary for a public Road.

A Plot or Draft of which is herewith annexed
no damage is claimed by parties through whose
land the above described road passes.
