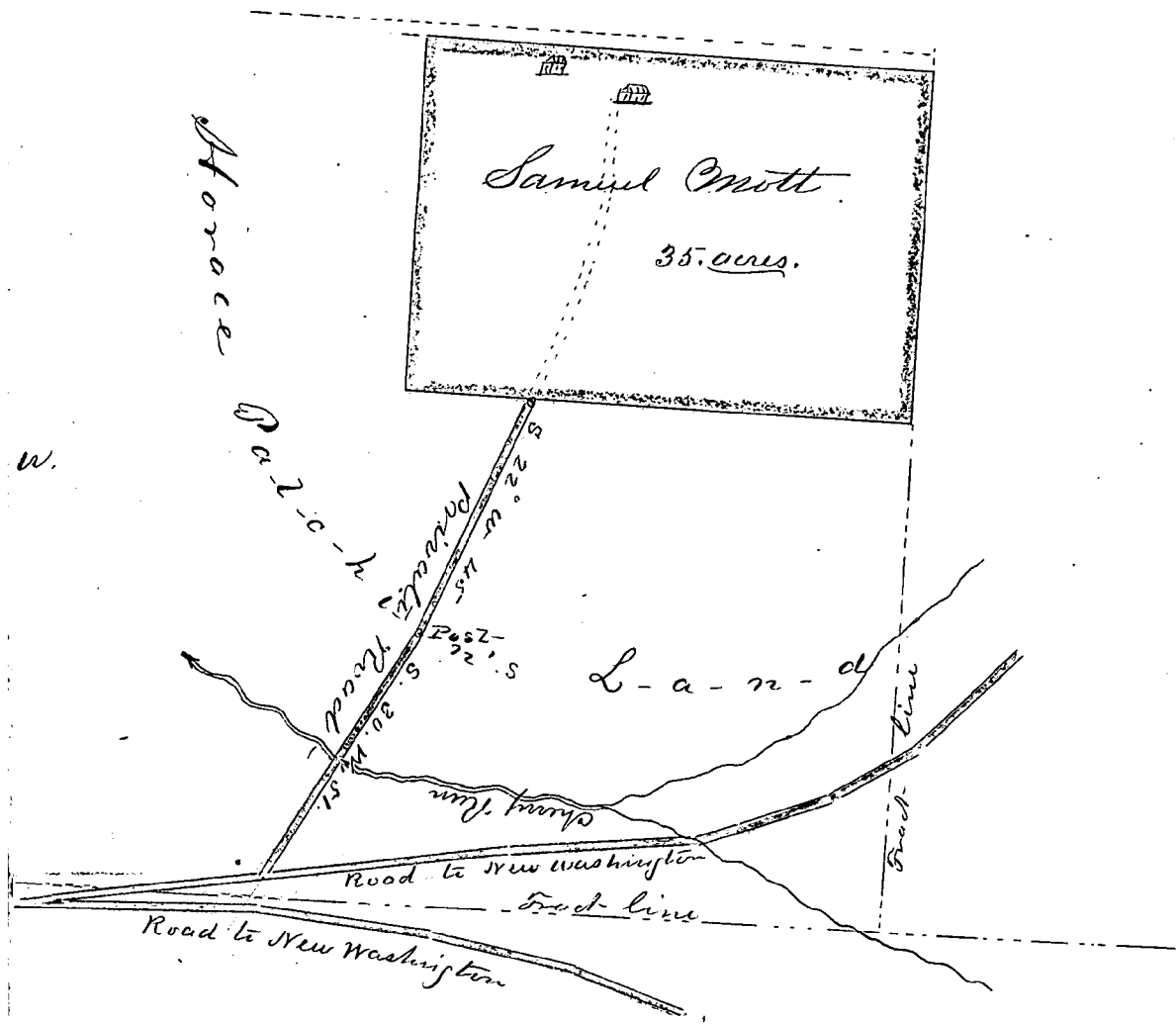
To the Honorable Judges of the Court of

We the undersigned Viewers
Appointed by the foregoing Order of Court to View
the road therein described Do Report: That
in pursuance of said appointment having first
given due notice to the Owner of whose land said
road was intended to pass of the time & place of said
view we all met and after being duly affirmed
according to Law proceeded to examine the ground
proposed for said road to pass over, and are of
opinion that the petition of Said Samuel Mott
for a Private road should be granted, he (Mott)
agreeing to fence said road which if he does
we are not of opinion that any Damages should be
awarded to any one by reason of the passage of said
road. We have viewed laid out and do return
for Private use the following road

Beginning at a Post in line of Samuel
Mott's land thence through lands of Hiron Patchin
South twenty two degrees west, Forty five Perches to a
Post, thence South thirty degrees west, Fifty one
Perches to Public road leading from Burnside
Borough to New Washington a Plot or Draft of
which we herewith annex

ROAD VIEWERS' REPORT.

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 23^d day of Sept A. D. 1878, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of Samuel Mott of the township of Burnside, in said county, setting forth that ~~they~~ ^{he} labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road ~~or highway~~ ^{private} leading from his residence in Burnside up to a point on a Public Road, leading from Burnside Village to New Washington, at a point at or near McCulloughs Log Slide

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint John Leonard Thomas Moore Thos A Melcher, who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioner as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law. By the Court.
