they are already engaged or about to engage in haul-
ing square timber, to Hog Back landing, at or near James
Bloom's on the Susquehanna River. That in order to
get to said landing, they are obliged to cross unim-
proved land of One John Garrison, who has refused
to allow them to cross, - that they have tried to agree
with him as to what damages they shall pay and
have been unable so to agree, - that they pass over
his land a distance of one fourth of a mile more
or less, - that it is necessary to crop, -

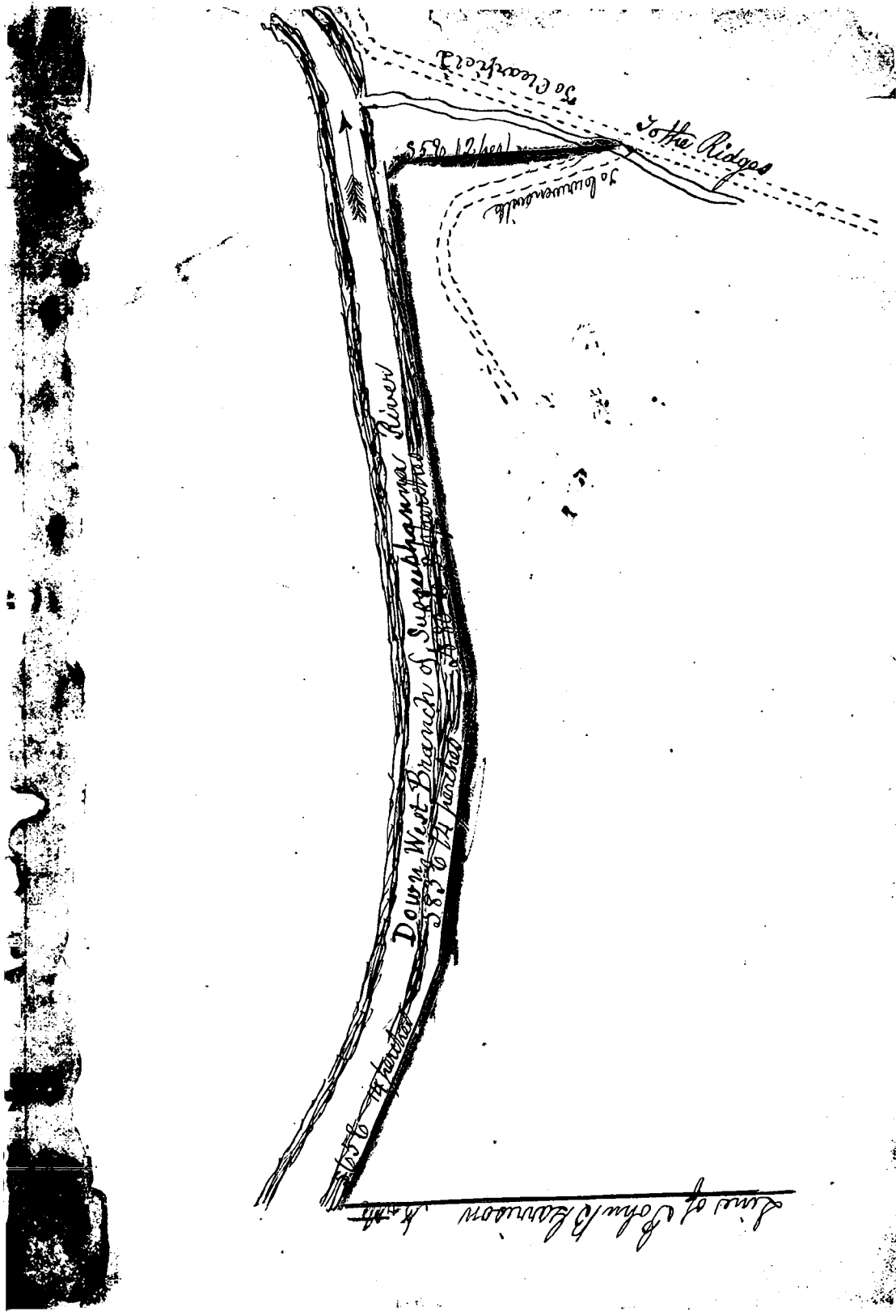

The undersigned viewers duly appointed in and by
virtue of the order of Court, to view a road across the unimproved
land of John B. Garrison to Hog Back landing on the land
of James Bloom, on the Susquehanna River;

Respectfully Report.

That in pursuance of said Order
they gave the said John B. Garrison a written notice which
was served upon him, a true & attested copy, delivered into his
hand, of the time and place of the meeting of the viewers, (a copy
of which is hereto attached) and that on the 17th day of February
all the viewers, to wit J. A. Moore, Lewis H. Bloom & John L. Bettle
met at the Mouth of Hog Back Run, at 10 o'clock A.M., and
after being first duly sworn according to law, proceeded to lay out the
road prayed for according to the several courses & distances, Beginning
at the east side of Hog Back run at Public Road, thence North 5° West
at 2 per centre of Run in all twelve perches, thence South 80° West twenty six
perches, thence North 83° West, fourteen perches, North 65° West fourteen perches
to line of John B. Garrison's land, which we estimate as necessary for a road
to haul timber & other lumber to Hog Back landing on the land of James
Bloom on the Susquehanna River, and we find the sum of Twenty Five Dollars
damages, to be paid to the said John B. Garrison by reason of said road
being laid on his unimproved land. All which is respectfully submitted,

You are hereby notified that a petition has been presented to the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County at January Sessions 1879, by sundry persons, accompanied with a bond in the sum of One Hundred Dollars, to satisfy any damages you may sustain by reason of the hauling of timber to "Hog Back" landing on the Susquehanna River, in accordance with the "Act of Assembly passed 15th May: 1871."

And the Judges of the said Court after due consideration had, have appointed the undersigned viewers, to lay out a road for the purpose of hauling timber over your unimproved land, and ascertain and appraise the damages you will sustain, by reason of the opening of said road. Said view will be made on Monday the 17th day of February Inst. the viewers to meet at Mouth of Hog Back Run at 10 o'clock A.M. of said day, when & where you are respectfully invited to attend.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace held before the Judges of said Court a Petition of Sundry inhabitants of said County was presented, setting forth that they were engaged in hauling Square timber and other lumber to Hogback Landing on the land of James Bloom on the Susquehanna River and in order to get to said landing they are obliged to cross the unimproved land of one John B. Garrison who has refused to allow them to cross Your Petitioners pray your honorable Court to appoint three disinterested persons to view and assess the damages if any may be done the said John B. Garrison by reason of their crossing his land of the aforesaid

And after due consideration had the Court have appointed James A. Moore Sews & Bloom & John S. Cuttle Viewers to view and lay out a road for hauling lumber over the unimproved land of John B. Garrison and ascertain and appraise the damages he will sustain by reason of said Road of which you will make return at the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be at Clearfield Second Monday of March 1879.
