# ROAD VIEWERS' REPORT.

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of October, A. D. 1878, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bradford, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from the Public Road road at the Public Road lot of Rudolph Buck now Old J. L. Wilson to the River Road on the dam of Greubaker's dam in Bradford Township.

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint James Alexander John H. Stewart Wm. Wilson, who, after being respectively sworn, or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree

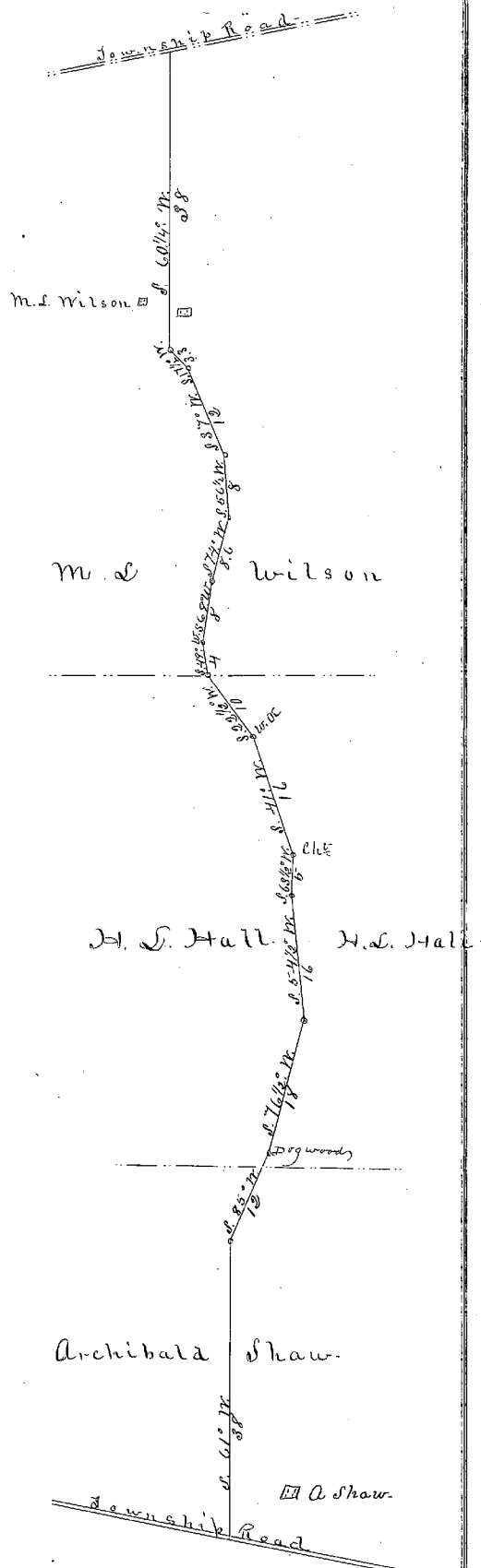

To the Hon. Judges of the Court of Allegheny Co., Pa.  
We the undersigned Viewers, appointed by the within Order of Court  
to view and lay out the road therein mentioned Respectfully report  
That having given notice of the time, and place of meeting;  
According to the Act of Assembly; And being all present  
at the view of the ground proposed for the said road, and  
being all sworn or affirmed, in pursuance of the said Order,  
(together with John H. Stewart, whose name is not signed to this  
Report) we have viewed, and laid out, and do return the  
following Road: viz. Beginning at a Post, at the Public Road,  
near Archibald Shaw's, thence through his land South fifty one  
degrees West Thirty Eight perches, thence South Eighty five degrees West  
Twelve perches to a marked dogwood in H. L. Hall's land, thence through  
his land South seventy six and a half degrees West Eighteen perches,  
South fifty four and a half degrees West sixteen perches, South fifty  
three and a half degrees West five perches to a Chestnut, thence  
South forty One degrees West sixteen perches to a white oak, South  
Twenty two and a half degrees West Ten perches to the line of Hall  
and M. L. Wilson, thence land of said Wilson, South forty nine  
degrees West, four perches, South sixty nine degrees West, eight  
perches, South seventy four degrees West, eight and six tenths per-  
ches, South fifty six and a half degrees West, eight perches,  
South thirty seven degrees West, twelve perches, South seventeen  
and a half degrees West, three and three tenths perches to  
a Post on M. L. Wilson's field, thence between David Wilson's House  
and Barn, along his lane, South fifty and a quarter de-  
grees West, thirty eight perches to the Township Road.

that were on occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law. By the Court.
