Change the place for
holding Elections

versus

Bell Township

Decree.

In the matter of the petition of citizens and qualified electors of Bell Township, for an election upon the question of Changing the place of holding the general, special and township elections, for said district, from the house of Robert McHaffey to the house of Thomas A. McGee, in said township.

And now to wit the 15th day of May A.D. 1879 at a Court of Quarter Sessions held at Clearfield in and for the County of Clearfield, the above mentioned petition, hereto annexed was presented, read and considered, and thereupon the Court grants the prayer of the said petitioners, and it is hereby ordered adjudged and decreed, that an election be held in said township by the qualified electors thereof, at the usual place of holding the general and township elections, that said election be conducted and held under the supervision and direction of the election officers, of the last preceding general election, to determine in due and legal form by ballot, upon the proposed change of the place of holding the general, special and township elections in said District from the house of Robert McHaffey to the house of Thomas A. McGee.

in said township. And the Constable
of said township is hereby directed to
give notice of said election, by at
least ten written or printed hand-
bills, set up in the most public
places within said township, at
least fifteen (15) days before the
time appointed for such election,
to be held at the usual place hold-
ing elections in said township, at
a certain day and hour, to be
appointed in said notice.

And the said election officers
shall duly record and certify
the proceedings of said election,
and make two copies thereof, with
a list of the qualified voters, duly
signed, attested and certified,
one thereof to be delivered by the
Constable to the Town Clerk, and
the other to the ~~Postmaster~~ ^{Postmaster} of the
County, to be duly certified and
returned to this Court.

And, it is further ordered that
the ballots to be voted at said
election shall be enclosed, and ~~written~~
as follows: Those voting for
the change shall write in

the same, "For this house, and
against change", and fold
and endorse thereon "Against
change", and those voting
for ~~shall~~ the change shall
write in said ballot, "For change
to McGee", and shall ^{fold and} endorse
upon the said ballot, "For
the change." By the Court

McGee
