To The Honorable the Quarter Sessions
of Charleity County S.C.

We the undersigned, appointed by the
annexed order do report; that in pursuance thereof,
after having been severally duly sworn and affirmed,
all the viewers appointed by said order re-viewed that
portion of said proposed road in Guilich Township,
leading from Wield's mill to a point in the plant
road near Jonesville, and also viewed a new line
of road from the said ~~from~~ said Wield's mill to
a point near Elliott corner on the road now leading from
Jonesville to Utahville, and the undersigned, a majority
of the viewers do agree that there is occasion for some
convenient outlet from said mill to connect with said road,
but are of opinion that as the road passed through entirely
unimproved and wild land and at a distance from any
clearing or improvement whatever, except the mill itself, that
therefore the road should be a private and not a public one,
as the only person to be benefited thereby would be the owner
of the mill, viz. Mr. Wield himself. And, having had respect
to the shortest distance, and the best ground for said
road, the undersigned viewers agree to locate the line
contemplated in previous view, starting from the said mill,
and terminating at a point in plant road near Jonesville,
and in lieu thereof supply & have laid out in such manner as
shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as
practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do
return for private use the following described private

Road, to wit: Beginning at a Maple tree on the East end
of Melch's mill dam; thence North, nine degrees (N. 9 $^{\circ}$ E.) East.
1625 ft. to a post, then North twenty eight degrees and forty five
minutes East 1712 ft. to a post; then North Eleven degrees East 1200
ft. to a post on township pond near Elliott's corner, said pond being the
one leading from Pungsville to Etahsville. The undersigned further
report that about one third of the pond: leading from the mill passes
through what is known as the Field property, and the other two
thirds through the lands of the Northhampton Land & Lumber Co.
and that he considers no damages will accrue from the
opening of said road through the lands of the parties referred to.
He further reports that before the said view, public notice
of the time & place of meeting of the viewers was given by
advertisement put up in the most public & convenient
place in the vicinity of the view, ten (10) days before said
meeting, and that he had been privately notified by the
viewers in person, at the time said view was about being
made, and he annex a plot or draft of said pond laid out,
showing the courses and distances, as also a sketch of the
position of the road vacated, said road being 380 perches
in length, over a large portion of rough, rocky and hilly ground,
while the new line is only 275 perches in length and over
much more favorable ground.

Chasfield County vs Aha County
of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of
the County of Chasfield, held
at Chasfield in and for said
County on the 16th day of April
AD 1874 before the Judges of the
said Court upon the petition
of sundry inhabitants of the
Township of Beccaria and
Guelich in said County setting
forth that a road hath lately
been laid out by order of the said
Court from Whahville in Beccaria
Township leading to or near
a point in the plank road to
where the road leading from
Dunsmuir in Guelich Township
connects with said road in Guelich
Township and praying the Court
to appoint proper persons to
review, locate and supply that
portion of said road in Guelich
Township leading from Wood
Mills to a point on the plank
road near Dunsmuir with a
view of changing the same from
Wood Mills to a point near
Elliot's corner on the road

now leading from Jamesville
to Ubalahville - Whereupon the
court upon due consideration
had of the premises do order
and appoint Frank Bolger,
Doubt George Drayton ^{Michigan} Robert who after being
respectively sworn out and affirmed
to perform the duties of their ap-
pointment with impartiality and
fidelity are to review the ground
proposed for said road, and
if any two of them agree that
there is occasion to vacate
or supply said road they shall
proceed to lay out the same
as agreeably to the desire of the
petitioners as may be, having
respect for the best ground for
a road and the shortest distance
in such manner as to do
the least injury to private
property and shall make
report thereof - stating partic-
ularly whether they judge the
same necessary for a
public or a private road
together with a plan or draft
thereof and the courses and

distances with reference to
the improvements through
which it may pass to the
next Court of Quarter Sessions
to be held for said County.
In which report they shall
state that they have been
sworn or affirmed accordy
to law —
