At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 13th day of March, A. D.

1880, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Woodward in said county, setting forth that Philip Renard

was asking viewers to view and lay out a public road from a point at or near Philip Renard's Butcher Shop on Hookdale and Parsonsville Township road to a point at or near public School House near Whiteside's Colliery

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint A. A. Hartman B. Bradley Frank Bolger

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th rule of Court.

RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

To the Honorable the Judges within named.

We the undersigned, persons appointed by the within order of Court, to review the road within mentioned and parts adjacent, respectfully report: That having been present at the review of the said road and parts adjacent, and having all been first severally sworn, and affirmed, in pursuance of the within order, we did review the same, and have laid out, and do return for public use the following road, to wit: Beginning at a point near Philip Remond's Butcher shop on Houbzdale and Passenville township road; thence North Forty Nine degrees West - Three hundred and Ninety Eight feet to post; thence North Forty degrees and Thirty minutes West - Two Hundred and Eighty feet to post; thence South - Twenty Two degrees and Thirty minutes West - Seven Hundred and Forty one feet to post; thence Thirteen degrees and Thirty minutes West - Five Hundred and Twelve feet to post - on township Road running from Whitehead Colliery to Houbzdale. A draft of which is hereto annexed, which road, so as aforesaid laid out we are of opinion is necessary for a public road.
