compensation as shall be assessed according to
law then this obligation to be null and void
otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County before the Hon Judges thereof. The petition of H. H. Lober and Matt. Jovin was presented on Sept. 22 1879. setting forth that they own a body of timber standing and lying along Saw Mill Run in Burnside Township Clearfield County at a distance of ~~from~~ two to three miles from the mouth thereof, and desire to make use of said stream and the improvements thereon for the purpose of getting said timber to market and that the firm of Hallett Hopkins and Snippen claim to own the improvements and right of way of said stream, and having filed a bond with approved sureties for the payment of compensation they being unable to agree with the owners as to compensation and praying the Court to appoint viewers to assess the same in accordance with the Act of Assembly of 28th of March 1871. Whereupon the Court appointed A. B. Shain, Alexander Drumm and Moses Bailey who are hereby directed to go upon the premises and after being duly sworn or affirmed are to ascertain and estimate the cost of the

dams and other improvements owned
by the owner or owners of the right of
way to said stream, adding thereto all
sums which may have been paid for
damages by such owners to land own-
ers or others, and shall fix determine
and assess the rate per thousand
feet to be paid by the petitioners to
the owners for the use of such improve-
ments and of the streams and shall
report the same to the Court of
Quarter Sessions
