We the undersigned persons, Appointed by the Annexed Order of Court - to view, Vacate, and Supply the Road, therein mentioned Respectfully report. That having given notice of the time, and place of meeting, according to the act of assembly - And being all present at the view of the Road proposed to be Changed. And being all Sworn, or affirmed in pursuance of the said Order of Court. We have viewed the said Road and made such Changes as in our judgment seemed necessary. 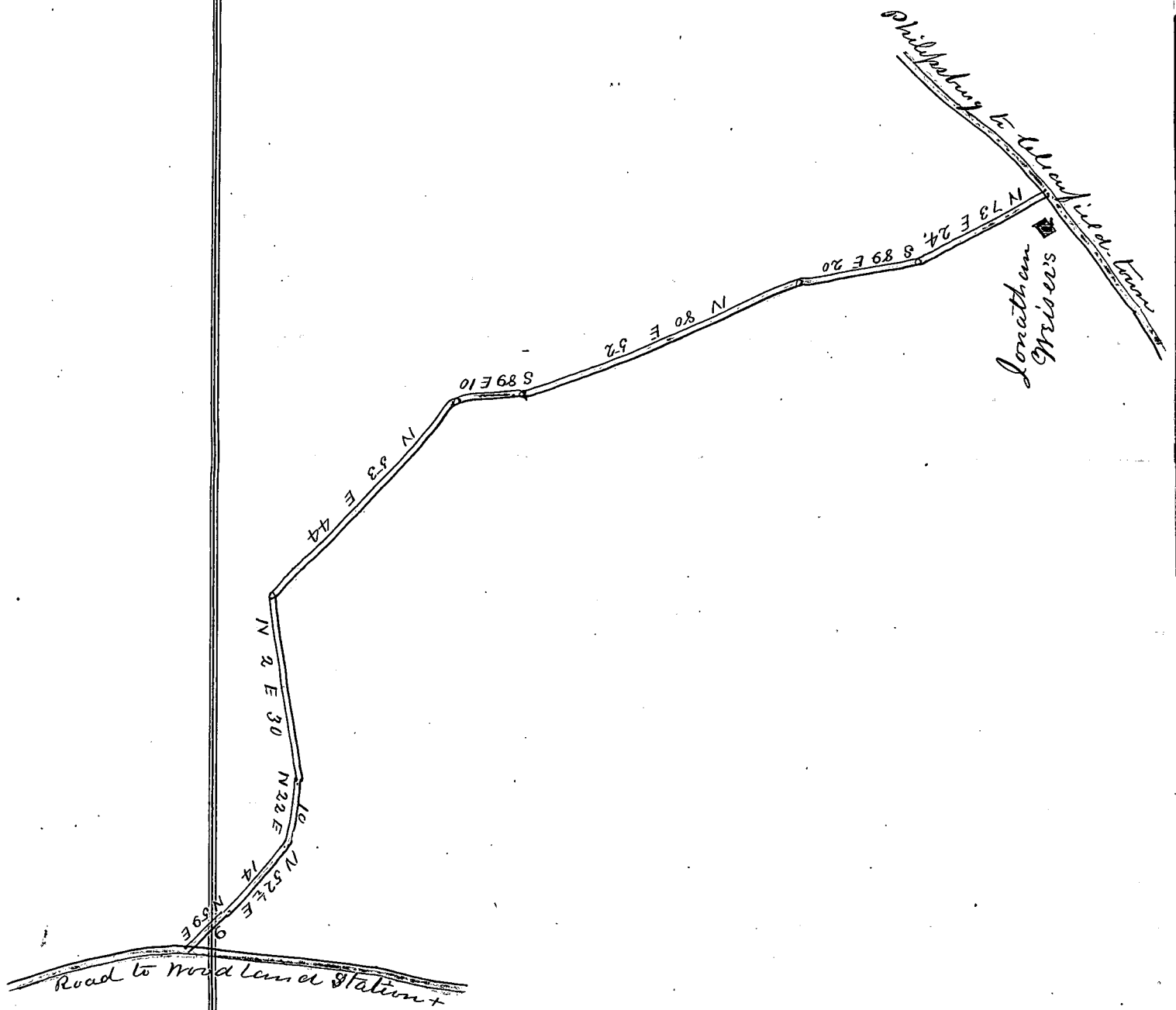
