To The Hon Judges of Court.

We the Undersigned Persons, Appointed
by the Annexed Order of Court to view,
Locate, and Supply the Road, therein men-
tioned Respectfully report. That having
given Notice of the time, and place of
Meeting, according to the Act of Assembly
and being all present at the view of the Road
proposed to be changed. And being all
Sworn, or affirmed in pursuance of the said
Order of Court. We have viewed the said
Road and made such changes as in our jud-
gment Seemed necessary. And do return the
following Road viz - Beginning at a Post
by marked trees on the South Bank of the Su-
quehanna River near Marion Branks House
and running along the Old Township Road, and
through land of Dr. J. P. Hoyt. South Twenty
One and a half degrees East. One hundred and
Ninety eight perches, South Thirty four and
a half degrees East. Thirty two perches. South
Fifty two and a half degrees East. Twenty perches
South Seventy degrees East. Twenty perches. South
Eighty one degrees East. Eighteen perches. South
Seventy four degrees East. Fifty perches. South
Forty four degrees East. Twenty perches to a
Post by the said Road, having adopted the
Old Township Road to this point.

Then leaving the old Road and running through
land of Reed & Owens South Thirty three degrees
East. Twenty seven perches to a Hemlock. Hence
South Fifty Six degrees East. Twenty two perches to a
Post. South Thirty Seven degrees East. East, eight per-
ches, Hence South Sixty degrees West. Twelve perches
South Sixty Six degrees West. Thirty eight perches.
South Seventy Six and a half degrees West. Sixteen
perches. South Sixty three and a half degrees West-
Nine perches. South Thirty nine and a half degrees
West. Six perches. South twenty degrees West. four
perches. South Nine and a half degrees West. nine
perches. South one half degree East. Six perches
to a Hemlock. South Three degrees East. Ten per-
ches. South Twenty four degrees West. Six perches.
South Thirty Three degrees West. Twelve perches.
South Eight and a half degrees West. Five perches.

South Forty degrees East. Fifteen perches.
South Fifty Two degrees East Thirty eight and five
tenths perches to a white Oak. Hence still throu-

cken, and James W. Cooper North Seventy degrees
East. Sixteen perches cross line of R. & G. & H. Mc-
Omcken. Thirty four perches, South Seventy Seven
and a half degrees East. Twenty five and five
tenths perches to a white pine stump. South
Eighteen degrees East. Thirty two perches; South

Fifty Six and a half degrees, East. Twenty per
ches to a white pine. Hence through land of
James W. Cooker, and land of J. W. Ross. South
Sixty nine degrees East Sixteen perches. Hence
South Eighty four and a quarter degrees East.
Twenty Seven perches, to a Post by the Town-
Ship Road near J. W. Ross.

Which Said Road as above described we
are of opinion is necessary for a public Road
that part of said Road from the River to
the Post where the Red line leaves, is the old
Road adopted and is now open and in use.
That part represented by the single Black
line is the part we supply in place of
that part vacant which is represented
by the Red line on the amejeror draft from
the Post to James Wiley's lane. That part
being up a very steep grade. We declare that
part vacant as soon as this Report is
Confirmed Absolute.

We are of opinion that J. W. Ross is entitled to
receive Six (\$6.) dollars damage,


