At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 31st day of August A. D.

1880, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Chest, Twp in said county, setting forth that a Road hath been lately laid out by order of the Court from ~~west~~ to Public road leading to Newburg intersecting the same at Henry Kitchens a part of said road to say from Wm Eggers on said route to Henry Kitchens will be very injurious to your petitioners & burdensome to the inhabitants of the Twp of Chest —

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons ^{Re vacate supply} to view and lay out the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint S. J. McCloskey, D. W. Moore and John Lytle who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th rule of Court.

RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

We the undersigned viewers appointed by the within
order of Court to view and lay out the road
therein mentioned, - Respectfully report. -

That having given notice of the time and
place of meeting according to the act of Assem-
bly, and being all present at the view of the
ground proposed for the said road, and being
all sworn or affirmed in pursuance of the said
order of Court, We have viewed and laid out and
do return the following road, viz: Beginning at
a post in the Township road leading to Westover
in land of Widow Loyd. Thence through her land
North Forty-two and one half degrees East, Eight -
perches to a post, North Seventy-three degrees East
Twelve perches to a post. North Thirty-six and one half degrees
East - Twenty-six perches to a Post. North Nineteen and
one fourth degrees East, Ten perches to a Post, North Thirty-
and three fourths degrees East, Twenty-eight perches to a
Post, North Forty-nine and one fourth degrees East, Forty-
Perches to a post. North Fifteen degrees East, Thirty-six
and three tenths perches to a White-Pine stump. North
Fifty-five and one fourth degrees East, Fourteen perches to
a Beech. North thirty-seven degrees East, Twenty six perches
to the Newburg road near Henry Kitchens. A Draft-
or Plot whereof is herunto annexed.

Which said road as aforesaid laid out we are
of opinion is necessary for public use.

The public road previously laid out (the marks
of which we were not able to find, and consequently
could not make a Survey of it,) we hereby declare-

Vacant. And we further agree that (There being no damage claimed) no one is entitled to any damage, through land the Road passes, as aforesaid laid out.
